Shared Services Proposal

Justification:

With Governor Jon Corzine's proposed funding reductions in state aid to small municipalities across New Jersey, all of the municipalities in Hunterdon County are facing significant cuts. Compounding the loss of state aid is the proposal by the legislature and the governor to require rural municipalities to partially reimburse the New Jersey State Police for its police services. Eleven such municipalities are situated in Hunterdon County. One, East Amwell, has already undertaken a shared-services study to merge with the City of Lambertville and West Amwell Township.

The Office of the Sheriff is in the best position to offer a more cost efficient alternative to those municipalities facing cuts in state aid and reimbursement costs to the New Jersey State Police. The Sheriff believes that her Office, with an administrative structure and physical plant already in place, can, through the creation of a patrol division, meet the police needs of the residents of the affected locales and provide more efficient and more comprehensive police services at a significantly reduced cost.

Municipalities:

The Sheriff's Office's proposed Patrol Division would offer comprehensive patrol (active and passive) and investigative services to the following municipalities: Alexandria Township, Bethlehem Township, Bloomsbury Borough, Glen Gardner Borough, Hampton Borough, Kingwood Township, Lebanon Borough, Milford Borough, Stockton Borough, and Union Township.

The estimated combined population of these municipalities is 26,696, according to the 2004 updated census information.

The total number of housing units equals 9,012.

The total square mileage equals 111.65.

The combined road miles in these municipalities are 395.8.

The final cost analysis demonstrates, at least to this writer, that the most equitable measure is by housing unit. It reduces the costs for the larger townships and, thus, makes them more likely to participate. On the other hand, it increases costs to the smaller boroughs by offsetting their advantages of fewer roads. The calculations by population or road miles, however, provides artificially low figures for the boroughs. In truth, Stockton Borough could never provide itself comprehensive police services for \$18,253, \$34,917 or \$36,339. Even \$49,242 is a tremendous bargain. Finally, the utilization of costs per housing unit by the Sheriff's Office permits the municipalities to evaluate their costs directly against the proposed costs of the New Jersey State Police.

By Hour:

It appears impossible at this time to accurately assess a per-hour cost for each municipality. Too many variables are still unknown (i.e., how many municipalities will participate; of those that do, are they seeking part- or full-time coverage, etc.). An average per-hour rate (e.g., simply taking the total cost and divide it by the number of hours in a year and then divide same by ten municipalities) is too simplistic, and does not provide an accurate figure because it would be far too high for a borough such as Stockton, and far too low for a township like Alexandria.

Moreover, even using the per-housing cost price and breaking same down by the hour does not work, as the following table demonstrates. The table shows the hourly rate if the municipality participates on a full-time, 24/7/365 basis. The table also shows the hourly rate if the municipality seeks only part-time coverage. For 12/7/365, the hourly rate was increased by 50% of the full coverage rate because some costs are fixed (i.e., a patrol car is needed whether the coverage is for 24 or 12 hours, etc.). This 50% increase is not based on anything other than estimations. There are 8,760 hours in a year. Obviously then, 12/7/365 would equal 4,380 hours.

As one can see, it would be impossible for the Sheriff's Office to provide the boroughs with comprehensive, 24/7/365 coverage for hourly rates under \$20. So how does one solve the dilemma? At this point, even using the New Jersey State Police's per-housing unit cost, with a 10% discount, and then dividing that figure by the number of hours in a year doesn't work for the boroughs. Although the hourly rate increased, the rate is still far too low.

If one were to use the average hourly rate under our per-housing unit cost or the discounted NJSP's per-housing unit cost, \$19.64 and \$26.57 respectively, the costs to a borough like Stockton to pay at either hourly rate for 12/7/365 coverage would exceed the cost of full

coverage. At \$19.64 per hour, part-time coverage would cost Stockton Borough \$86,023. At \$26.57, the cost would be \$116,377.

Cost Comparison to New Jersey State Police:

The information provided to the Sheriff's Office is that the New Jersey State Police are seeking compensation per housing unit. The cost per housing unit is allegedly \$287 per housing unit. The Sheriff's projected total costs are \$1,720,028. At \$287 per housing unit and 9,012 housing units involved, the NJSP's total projected cost to these municipalities would total \$2,586,444. This represents a difference of \$866,416 or approximately 50% higher.

Revenues:

In addition to saving participating municipalities money, the Sheriff's proposal would also generate revenue for the municipalities. Currently, because the New Jersey State Police write all of the motor vehicle tickets and complaints in these locales, the municipalities only receive court costs. The State of New Jersey obtains all of the fines. Through a shared services agreement, the County and the municipalities could split the revenue generated by the Sheriff's Office.

Because no detailed information regarding motor vehicle tickets, summons or other complaints specific to these particular municipalities, data from other sources was used for comparison and estimation purposes. The municipal court-generated revenues for Clinton Township and Hopewell Township, one municipality within Hunterdon County and one that borders the county, were utilized. Both have their own police forces. Clinton Township has 13,788 citizens and is 33.9 square miles. Hopewell Township has a population of 17,742 and covers 60.4 square miles. Combined, they have a population of 31,530 and a square mileage of 94.3 miles. According to both townships 2007 budgets, revenue generated by their municipal courts totals \$668,325 (Clinton Twp. - \$285,000, Hopewell Twp. \$383,325). Revenue analysis shows that Hopewell Township's municipal court generated \$6,346 per square mile, and \$21.61 per citizen. Clinton Township generated \$8,407 per square mile, and \$20.67 per citizen.

Although the two townships combined have a larger population than the nine potential municipalities in Hunterdon (31,530 v. 26,696), the two townships square mileage is somewhat smaller (111.65 v. 94.3)

Because of the similarities in revenue generated based on population, the average of those two figures (\$21.20) will be used. If the nine municipalities generated \$21.20 per citizen, the combined revenue would total \$565,955. If the County retained 50% of the revenue and the remainder were divided revenue based on population of the municipalities, each would receive the following approximate amount:

Only two townships (Union and Bethlehem) and three Boroughs (Hampton, Milford and Stockton) participate. The Patrol Division's staffing would be reduced to 1 sergeant, 3 corporals, 6 Sheriff's Officers and 1 Investigator.
